Welcome to summer and the annual June Challenge - a friendly birding competition from 6/1 to 6/30. On June 28th, CCAS is co-sponsoring a "Florida Smart Fertilizing & Landscaping Workshop" at the historic Courthouse in Inverness from 10am-1pm. A flyer is attached.

Looking ahead, we are working on the 2025 Christmas Bird Count, which will take place on January 2nd (Fri.) or January 3rd (Sat.). Our 2024 CBC was submitted and all 118 species were accepted by National Audubon. The count was lower than average for Citrus County due to a number of factors, many of which were out of our control. Other nearby count circles reported similarly low numbers. A big thank you to everyone who participated - especially the team leaders, the compiler and our firsttime organizer - Pat Bazany!

In response to the Time Change Survey, we will be moving our evening chapter meetings to 3pm, with doors opening at 2:30 - at the same place, on the same day, the third Wednesday of the month. Please mark your calendar. We will include reminders in our monthly newsletters.

Also, we are considering some special evening programs as well as Saturday events and will have a "sunset" field trip and a boat trip on our schedule. Other ideas are welcome. We are planning for an October field trip to Inglis Island and a November kayak trip, but here are the fall dates that have been firmed up:
